- The Engineering Team recently took part in a works party to refurbish and replace elements of the Trailer Mast - including a new tow hitch and breakaway cable, new mud-guards, plus rust-proofing.
- We also checked the operational status of the Leisure Battery, Solar Panel and Victron Energy MPPT - all of which were in great condition - securing our ability to operate off-grid if required
- A visit to our Burnham RF to Icom LTE
 Crosslink site was carried out, to upgrade the
 Battery (which had been in service for 15+
 years) and check the Antenna all perfect!
- We also carried out a pre-works inspection of our Maldon & Chelmsford Sites, ready to prepare a schedule of works, due to take place during October - primarily Antenna replacement and general improvements

- As you will be aware, a mandate was set out at the AGM earlier this year, to you our Membership, regarding the aspiration to deliver on our goal of setting up Essex RAYNET as a CIO Charity during 2025-2026
- Following months of discussion, seeking independent advice and researching the various options available, we feel we now have the relevant information we need to proceed further
- As such, we are currently in the process of fine tuning the draft Constitution, MOU and Policy Documents for the Charitable Incorporated Organisation, as well as the application form for the Charities Commission
- Further details regarding the merger between Essex RAYNET CIO and Essex RAYNET 'as-is' will be explained in a email / Microsoft Teams Meeting at a future date
- In short, Essex RAYNET CIO and Essex RAYNET will operate in a 'hybrid' manner, which enables us to setup and run the CIO, in a way which best supports the objectives of Essex RAYNET

- As part of our Equipment upgrade programme, we have ordered a new lcom Dual Mode - Digital Voice Repeater for UHF, which will complement our existing fleet and that of our Members, whilst still offering FM Voice as required

FARLEIGH HOSPICE - CYCLE FOR LIFE 2025



- We supported Farleigh Hospice on Sunday 7th September, by providing resilient Safety Radio Communications, using Amateur Radio, to keep the Cyclists, Marshalls and First Aid Team safe, on the 20-50-100km routes on the Cycle for Life Event in Chelmsford
- A team of 18 Operators, including assistance from Mid-Herts (G1BYY), Kent RAYNET (M1EGP) and Forest Heath (G6XRX) who in total volunteered over 162 Hours - thank you so much, it wouldn't be possible without your support!
- We deployed a FM Voice Inband Repeater + 3x Crossband Repeaters (MB9HAT + MB9HAR + MB9ADY) and Automated Packet Reporting System (APRS) to enable us to track the location of Operators and Sweeps as they navigated the three routes
- We did experience some abnormalities whilst using FM Voice on our Inband Repeater, however we were able to overcome these issues through the use of a pre-planned deployment of our Fixed Repeater Network across Essex, which linked into our Temporary Network deployed on the day resilience at its very rawest form!
- We can report that over 300 Cyclists took part across the three distances, raising an impressive £20k+ in donations for Farleigh Hospice, which is a really good result

















<u>ST HELENA - MIDNIGHT WALK 2025</u>

- We supported St Helena Hospice on Saturday 27th September in the city of Colchester, providing resilient Safety Radio Communications, using Amateur Radio, to keep the Walkers, Marshalls and First Aid Team safe, as they navigated the 4 and 7.5 mile routes
- This year was a special one for St Helena, who celebrate 40 years of providing Hospice Care in Essex - as such, the theme was 80s - party like its 1985!
- The event saw some 500+ walkers take part, all helping to commemorate and raise funds for this fantastic hospice - so far, donations are estimated to be in the region of £33k+ - what a great result!
- We deployed FM + Icom Digital Voice Crossband Repeaters, as well as using Automated Packet Reporting System (APRS) to track the Sweep Operators and check Operator position on the two routes - thanks to Martello Tower Group for the use of MB7UCE, plus the hosting of MB9HAU Colchester for Essex RAYNET
- This was also the first opportunity we have had to test the coverage of MB9HAU, our FM Voice Crossband Repeater located in Colchester, with the results being promising - Colchester due to its topography, can be an RF nightmare!
- Thank you to Trident Medical who worked closely with Essex RAYNET and St Helena Hospice, to help provide Medical Assistance across the event
- · We look forward to supporting the event next year keep an eye on the diary!
